<b>2.0</b>	<p><b><u>POLICE REPORT</u></b>          Inspector McMillan updated the meeting on recent events in the town. Priorities are still the Main Street and engaging with young people. Police have been in the area speaking to the young folk, have also spoken to Greggs about shutting down wi-fi in the evenings. There will be a police presence in the area over the next few weeks. There have been a few fires behind the shops recently and the police will be discussing this with The Traders’ Association and NAC. Young kids are open about the fact that there is nothing for them to do – they do want to be safe, warm and have wi-fi – there are some diversionary activities planned and the police continue to engage with these young people.          Thefts of wheelie bins continue to be a big issue – this is a major problem throughout North Ayrshire.          There have been a few house break-ins, with one arrest. Fly tipping in Longford Avenue continues to be an ongoing problem – the blocks that had been placed there have been removed.          Locality Policing will begin in our area soon and Inspector McMillan wishes to introduce the team to KCC. He will give a presentation on this team and its impact at April meeting.</p>	
<b>3.0</b>	<p><b><u>Presentation from Forestry Commission</u></b>          Stewart Towers, a Planning Forester gave an interesting and informative presentation on the planned Community Woodland area at Woodgreen Farm on the Blair Road. The concept is being developed and he is keen to get feedback from the community as to what they would like from the planned area. The site will cover 30 hectares and will take a number of years to be fully developed. It is expected that this will be a great natural asset to the area and enjoyed by the community. Walks will be provided in a woodland area. A fuller draft plan will be presented in the next few months.          JH asked about parking – the access may not permit for this, but infrastructure still to be decided on.</p>	

	<p>JW commented that this would be a good area for schools to visit, and a great opportunity to engage with young people in the town.          TL spoke about an area in Dalry that was transformed in a similar way and spoke very highly of it.          ST explained that this will be the property of, and managed by, The Forestry Commission.          JK expressed an interest in having an archaeological survey done on the area.          All agreed that this was a very positive plan for the town and welcomed the development.</p>
