2.0 PRESENTATION from KAREN YEOMANS – EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR for ECONOMY & THE COMMUNITY NAC

Karen provided an excellent presentation on work being carried out in North Ayrshire, particularly regarding economic regeneration and development. Karen was keen to voice the strengths of the communities and how these link with the economy. She also impressed the importance being placed on the employability and skills of the people within these communities and how this helps with future development. Karen also provided a full account of work across many of the services and action plans in NAC and how these are helping with the regeneration throughout North Ayrshire. Good progress has been made, but Karen acknowledged that more needs and continues to be done. A copy of the presentation is available for all.

A discussion ensued on some of the real positive aspects with North Ayrshire and NAC.

JK commented on the fact that signage promoting the positives of the area could be better.

JW thanked Karen for her presentation and for taking the time to visit KCC. He also provided some slides on particular areas of concern within Kilwinning, highlighting some of the abandoned buildings in the town and the lack of premises available for start-up and growing businesses. The positives such as good transport links & the college campus were also pointed out. A positive action plan for further regeneration and development of Kilwinning would be welcomed by all. JW expressed a keen interested for investment in start up business premises within Kilwinning. Karen was grateful to hear the concerns and ideas of KCC.

RS commented that community groups like KCC have an excellent opportunity to work with Karen & NAC towards a neighbourhood action plan.

	CH commented on the need for greater consultation within the community. Agreement that there is a lot of expertise within the community that can be tapped into. JF commented on the need for greater links and collaboration with the college. JC commented on the empty shops within the Main Street & how these might be better utilised. JW also commented on the valuable services provided by the Community Wardens who were present at the meeting. Karen stated that she is looking forward to further developing her relationship with KCC.

	PC Kevin Reynolds updated on recent crimes in the town and provided a report. 26 house breakings since last report only 2 detected – this is a concern. Kevin did state that sometimes these can take a bit of time to investigate. Commented that Main Street continues to be a problem. CH stated that the police have been doing a good job in enforcing the traffic restrictions in the Main Street. RS asked about the break-ins – were they in a specific area? PC Kevin Reynolds stated that they were all over the town. Urged people to report anything suspicious. CH commented on the success of the 'campus cops'. CW commented on the state of the Abbey Grounds and the hope that the police will continue to patrol the area. Commented on help of Community Wardens. JK commented on complaints from a Robert Pollock re dangerous parking in Baberton Way. Asked police to have a look at this area. JM asked about drugs coming into Kilwinning – where are they coming from? Police reported that they can come from all over the world. Written report provided.
